


#### **Erosion** United States, 100', 2005








#### **The Mind Snatcher**






#### **Bunker Hill**






#### **3 Efes** Brazil, 120', 2007





The Hoppers, serial murderers and rapists, mysteriously return from the 70s, and bring horrifying psychedelia with them. With comedy, subversion, satire and true gore, the students must face escalating attacks, shocking circumstances and visceral disgust.



#### Fear House

United States, 88', 2008

Relatives and colleagues of reclusive writer Samantha Ballard track her to an isolated home in the California desert where they discover her some nine months later severely traumatized. She greets them with a grim announcement that they will die if they attempt to leave the house. After Samantha's ex-husband and his girlfriend suffer horrible deaths while trying to escape, the others realise that she was serious.



#### **Bad Brains**

Italy, 83', 2005

David and his fiancée Alice aren't two simple serial killers. They are looking for something inside the bodies of their victims. And they will continue to kill people until they find what they are looking for. Their crazy love story and strange research go on, but something changes when they meet a weird man named Mirco. This guy seems to know many things about Alice and David's past, and it seems that he isn't scared of them.



United Kingdom, 90', 2008



#### The 500 Stolen Babies

France/Argentina, 93', 2013

During the dark era of Argentina's dictatorship from 1976 to 1983, the ruling military imprisoned pregnant women, forced them to give birth in secret maternity hospitals, killed them, and stole their babies as the spoils of war. 35 years later, a groundbreaking trial begins in Buenos Aires, the result of a relentless struggle by the Grandmothers of the Plaza de Mayo. They have successfully traced 107 of these children and their quest goes on.

#### Grey Wolf: Hitler's Escape UK/Argentina, /52'/80', 2012

This is a dramatization of real events the untold story of Adolf Hitler's escape to Argentina at the end of WW2. Based on interviews with eye witnesses in Argentina and years of research, the film details the collusion between US business and the Nazi party that allowed Hitler, Eva Brown, their daughter Uschi, Gestapo' Mueller and SS-Obergruppenfuhrer Hermann Fegelein to escape to Argentina where he died tormented, demented and betrayed, at 'La Clara' forty five miles from the town of San Carlos de Bariloche in the Argentine Andes, at 3pm on February 13<sup>th</sup>, 1962.






#### 40 Years of Silence



#### Bare Hands and Wooden Limbs United States, 53', 2006






#### United States, 48', 2008

#### My Home, Your War

An Iragi family deals with the disruptions and terror of war as it affects their daily lives. Meet Layla, her shy teenager son who she suspects is working with the anti-US resistance, her workaholic husband and her starry eyed sister . This film is not only a historical document of the Middle East, it is a personal account of how these changing times are playing out in Arab women's lives, and how Iragi women have become the first casualties of democracy denied.



#### The Blood of My Brother


tank on fire, or the cold, distant stare of a dead Iraqi fighter...

Slum Dog Millionaire is a true adaptation of the reality of the slums of Dharavi, in the heart of Bombay. The 530 acre slum produces 200,000 wallets, handbags and briefcases every year. There are 1000 garment-making workshops employing 40,000 people and the 1000 pottery units have an annual turnover of around US\$4m. Entrepreneurship sprouts on the roadside and developing inside tine sheds that can barely hold three adults.



Australia, 55'

In a remote region of Australia, Quenten Agius discovers human skeletal remains in the middle of a multi-million dollar development. Is it a murder or an ancestor? This the inside story of Quenten and his family fighting to save what is left of their ancient heritage and culture. This multi-layered film is a microcosm of what is happening to Aboriginal peoples all over Australia. In the lucky country, 40,000 years of ancient heritage, culture and traditions are being swept away - it's a national disgrace.

#### Raul the Terrible

Australia/Argentina, 52' & 80', 2006



#### **Trafficking**


Singapore/India, 52'

So he and his brothers decided to make a career out of fighting trafficking, AIDS and female feticide. Against the apathy of social service agencies and the authorities, the three men went against the tide of conventions to rescue girls from their abductors, teach prostitutes about AIDS prevention and villagers about conmen in the trafficking trade.


#### **About Face**





#### **Afghan Girls Can Kick**

#### Millions - A Lottery Story



Rags to riches stories and their sordid flip side - tales of millions wasted - are common fodder for tabloids and TV news, but the public is rarely allowed more than a superficial glimpse into the world of instant, unexpected wealth. Millions follows the lives of six different big money winners to show in detail just how dramatically a life-changing experience can deeply affect ordinary people.



#### 7 Days & 7 Dogs

Australia, 53'

With a large growth and a heart murmur, the vet gives Suki, a border collie/kelpie cross, only weeks to live. But when her owner Billie, a psychic animal communicator, asks Suki how can she help her, the dog 'says' she wants more outings. Billie and Andrew pack up their daughter Tamsin, their 7 rescued dogs with all their disparate personalities and take off on a seven day adventure in their antique blue van.



#### **Waves of Change**

Singapore, 2x23'

The 2004 Indian Ocean Tsunami killed more than 225,000 people in eleven countries, and inundated communities with waves up to 30 metres. It was one of the deadliest natural disasters in history. Here, we revisit the affected areas in India, Indonesia and Sri Lanka for a look at how the disaster has transformed hundreds of thousands of lives and assess how relief and reconstruction efforts are progressing.



#### **Thaipusam**

Singapore, 52'

This Hindu festival transcends the physical and the spiritual. One of the largest celebrations takes place at the temple at Batu Caves, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, attracting over one million devotees who spear their bare flesh with iron rods and pierce their naked backs with sharp hooks. Two devotees will help us understanding the real and the unreal in this ritual.

#### The Monk on Horseback

Singapore, 52'

Phra Khru Ba is known as the 'Tiger Monk' travels the border region between Thailand, Laos and Myanmar, notoriously known as the Golden Triangle. A former Muay Thai Boxer, the monk now saves children from falling prey to drug activities and violence. His monastery acts as an orphanage and a ranch, and he teaches these novices Muay Thai so they can protect themselves in this hostile region. His own life has been threatened many times, from the drug lords he opposes.

#### Ayen's Cooking School for African Men Australia, 52'

The women of Sudan do not allow their men into the kitchen because they believe their penises might burn over the cooking fires. But when a group of refugee Sudanese men in Australia are found starving because they don't know what to do with a fridge full of groceries, Ayen Kuol, a Sudanese health worker decides to challenge a million years of custom and culture and start a cooking school for African men.

#### Tears for Sale Singapore, 52'

It's a unique culture, much practiced in Asia. It's an act of filial piety, a tribute to the dead of how much they are being missed with the passing. The more tears are shed at the funeral, the better. So enter a unique group of people, the professional mourners whose tears are for sale. Shot in China, Taiwan and India, this documentary enters the lives of these professional mourners as they try to keep the tradition alive and their arduous journey walking down the valley of death.



#### The Mummy Thief of Toraja

Indonesia, 52'

In Tana Toraja, Indonesia, the people lay their dead to rest in elaborate ceremonies that often last for many days. This film features a villager who turns into a mummy thief when he becomes trapped in the vicious cycle of debts after his family throws an expensive funeral for an ancestor.



#### **Superman of Malegaon**

India, 52'

The documentary is about the making of the movie "Malegaon ka Superman". Juxtaposing the frenzied production activities against a stark socio-economic backdrop of Malegaon, the documentary reveals the cathartic and spellbinding importance of the 'magic of movies' on the people. Ironically, all this is not a sustained effort to rise above their exploitative milieu but merely a temporary escape into the fantastical world of films.



#### **Our Bush Wedding**

Australia, 52'

While in jail, Gordon Syron, an Australian Aborigine, learnt to paint. When he was released in the 70's, Elaine Pelot, an American photographer, showed up to photograph his overtly political paintings. They became good friends, and one late night, after sharing a bottle of Bacardi, Elaine let it slip that she was attracted to him. Now in their 60's, Gordon has finally proposed. With only weeks to go Gordon gets ill and it looks like the marriage plans will be put on permanent hold.



#### The Bridge at Midnight Trembles

Australia, 52'

In 1990 Richard Moir was diagnosed with Parkinson's. Richard's career as an actor faded. Then his marriage crumbled. Richard decided in 2003 to have the procedure known as Deep Brain Stimulation. Essentially two electrodes are embedded deep in the brain to stimulate the subthalamic nucleus with an electrical current. The film follows Richard through the tense months leading up to the operation, as he takes on the greatest challenge of his life.







**Rat Ribbons** Australia, 27'

Rat Ribbons' will dispel the centuries of defamation and bad press rats have received worldwide. It shows that rats are not just sewer dwelling animals that live to bite you but are adorable little pets with personality. They are cleaner than cats, smarter than dogs and they fit inside your top pocket. If you have ever been to a dog show, cat show or a horse show, and you thought they were bitchy... you haven't been to a rat show.



It's been seven years since the Wyoming Indian High School Chiefs have won a state championship in basketball. For most schools, this is a rather unremarkable statistic. But for the inhabitants of the Wind River Indian Reservation, who have experienced a century and a half of injustice, basketball is a form of empowerment, self-expression, and access to the world outside "the rez."




Singapore, 8x23'


Inferno

#### Song of Life

Israel, 50'

The Israeli Philharmonic Singers choir is about to go on a tour to Poland where they will perform at the ceremony commemorating 60 years since the liberation of the Auschwitz concentration camp. During the rehearsal in Tel Aviv, they sing a famous requiem by Verdi. 76 year-old Great Klinsberg, who has just joined the choir, sang this requiem 62 years before, as a child in the ghetto of Terezienstadt.

#### The Untouchables

India, 52'

They live in constant fear of being publicly humiliated, paraded naked, beaten and raped. They are not allowed to drink from the same wells as the upper casts or drink from the same cups at tea stalls. 138 million of them live like this every day. They are the Dalits or the Untouchables of India. This is a powerful documentary about one Dalit woman's crusade against the atrocities to fellow human beings who are entrapped within their own caste.

Pure Love, Pure Sex? - Stories about all the polys-gandry, -gyny and gamy. Are humans polyandrous by nature? 

Chennamma and Yelamma were stone-crushers. Kalavati and Zayda were house-maids. Illiterate and born into poverty, it didn't seem that there could be light at the end of their tunnel. So they decided to make their own light. This is a powerful story about the empowerment of women by women. Called India's barefooted solar engineers, these women taught themselves how to make, install and maintain solar lamps in villages that have no street lighting







#### **Documentaries - Art**

#### A Loving Friend

Australia, 93

While ordinary pedophiles are despised, many artists who are pedophiles are excused and even continue to enjoy admiration. With a focus on Donald Friend who lived in Bali, the film uncovers artist pedophiles who have operated in vulnerable communities across Asia and Australia since the 1930's. While the Catholic Church is reluctantly facing the exposure of its pedophile culture, the art world is yet to do the same.



Australia, 26'

One of Australia's leading landscape artists, William Robinson has twice won the Archibald Prize for his self-portraits. Shot in Paris, Brisbane and Melbourne, SILLY & SERIOUS presents Robinson at work, playing Debussy, and discussing his work: his love for old Laurel and Hardy movies; how humour and sadness can exist in the same portrait.

#### Last Breath of a Wildlife Artist.

Australia, 60


John Spies loved wild animals since the moment he had first been able to see them. It was an enduring love that was to remain with him for the rest of his life. The film follows John Spies days before his death. He is one of Australia's truly great wildlife artists; a gentle, introspective, solitary man whose only real concern in the world was to give affection to those he loved and to care for his beloved creatures of the forest.

#### **New Brow**

United States, 85'

Robert Williams, Anthony Ausgang, Isabel Samaras, Shag, Shepard Fairey, Tim Biskup and the magazine Juxtapoz are just a few of the contemporary artists and magazine behind the Modern movement. What traits, other than a title, do these artists have in common? Are they inspired by the world around them Whatever it may be, their work is visible. You have seen it. You probably just don't know it.







#### **Liquid Stone**

Australia, 52'

Construction began on La Sagrada Familia in 1883, but after Antonio Gaudi's death the building languished for nearly a century. In 1979, Australian architect Mark Burry was given the chance to crack the code needed to complete Gaudi's masterpiece. He used aeronautical software to unlock Gaudi's design strategy. Now the famously unfinishable building is nearing completion and represents one of the most outstanding technical achievements of modern time.



#### A U-Tube Music Fair

United States, 78'

These twelve documentary shorts of classical piano, ballet and opera performances were initially posted on YouTube by Webster Young, a neo-Classical composer. The unifying thread in this "music fair" is his commentary of child geniuses in music, the ear for music, writing music and musical instruments. Young's narration and piano performances are filmed in front of theatrical scenery, of the old Metropolitan Opera house in New York.



#### **Desert Heart**

Australia, 27'

In the remote Aboriginal community of Bidyadanga, a new art movement has emerged. At its helm is Daniel Walbidi, whose art is inspired by stories of his tribes' homeland. Vibrant and bold motifs manifested in a discordant array of colours, hot desert reds together with the bright turquoise blues and greens of the coast. After a series of sell out exhibitions, these unique works became the "next big thing."



#### One for Shakespeare

United States, 53'

The film explores the creative process of making Shakespeare's comedy "As You Like It" into an opera. It delves into the creative process including Webster Young's setting of "All the World's a Stage" and "Under the Greenwood Tree". Musical performances from the showcase and a recording session include 7 arias sung by up-and-coming young singers in New York, and 4 orchestra pieces from the opera.



#### **Medieval Imagination**

Australia, 26'

This documentary looks at the bringing together of 90 handmade, precious books dating from the 8th to the 16th centuries, including the oldest European book to ever cross the Equator. Behind the scenes of this exhibition and its creation, lies the fascinating story of the richest repository of Western knowledge and art, from the fall of the Roman Empire to the advent of printing.



#### **Voiceless Art**

China/Singapore, 50'

One artist uses his head as his inspiration to paint. Another sees art in poor people. Yet another has created his best art after being held in house arrest. Three very different and highly talented artists show us their world through their paintings of Indonesian society, underscoring the amazing artistic talents of this country. This documentary literally paints a picture of Indonesia that takes you away from earthquakes, tsunamis and floods. It's art by the common man about the small people.



#### **All Things Paper**

Singapore, 6x23'

The film is dedicated to "paper maestros" from all continents who are constantly redefining the traditional usage of the humble paper and taking it one step further with their ingenuity and amazing visions. It will constantly surprise viewers with the ideas, creativity, imagination and craftsmanship of the "paper maestros". They will demonstrate how paper has become an integral piece of their work and life.



#### **Scissorhands**

China/Singapore, 30'

See China through the talented hands of three famous paper artists in China. "Scissorhands" traces the works and thoughts of Gong Lin, Liang Gui Xin and Lu Xue.

Each has his or her different style in cutting up a picture of China which will present a unique perspective not seen before.



#### **Copy Artists**

Singapore/Vietnam, 50'

The Dafen Village in southern China is the oil painting copy capital of the world. It's here where the masterpiece meets the mass market, where the world's great oil paintings are copied. Thousands of artists turn out reproductions of famed European masterpieces for homes and businesses around the world. Last year, Dafen generated about US\$35m in sales. In this film, copy-artists reveal what are their thoughts about what their 'art' is doing to the art world.



#### **Spirit of the Time**

China/Singapore, 8x23'

From Beijing to Yunnan, a group of avant-garde artists are painting, sculpting, photographing and installing images of China as they see it. They create works in their own likeness in the name of cynical-realism; they paint updated landscapes that are a world away from traditional Chinese works, or burn Cultural Revolution materials to form collages of Mao – and the international art world is intrigued.



#### Little Red Art

China/Singapore, 52'

In the eyes of two of China's most talented modern artists, 'red' has layers of meaning that is portrayed in their series of works. This is a story of two artists' opinions and perspectives about China during the Cultural Revolution and China today. Artists Chen Wenling and Ren Si Hong talk about their inspiration for these powerfully witty and amazingly evocative sculptures that speak volumes in their little red postures.



#### Paper Art

China 30

Chinese paper cutting is a form of Chinese folk art which uses paper as material and a pair of scissors as the tool. Incredibly beautiful and intricate patterns are often created in a matter of minutes. This is a story of how a folk artist grew to become one of China's famous modern artists - Gon Lin. Through his art, we get a unique view of modern and contemporary Chinese society.



#### Art

Rash Australia, 90'

This film explores the cultural value of graffiti's contribution to a very public dialogue. It conveys the commitment, ideals and beliefs in a thriving alternative art practice. These artists bang away at the community conscience by sticking this artwork right in the public eye. The spirit of rebellion is being channeled into street art and these visual conversations are spreading across the walls of Melbourne. RASH offers a rare insight into graffiti artists' world view.



This film traces Carol Jerrems' rapid rise from gifted student to a taboo shattering artist, intercutting Jerrems' own documentation of her slow demise from a rare cancer. The story begins in 1971 and, as Jerrems barely outlived the decade, this portrait doubles as a striking evocation of the turbulent seventies as seen from bohemian Melbourne and Sydney.

#### Faozan's Space

Indonesia, 57'

Djelos Djokaj is a famous 70 year-old Serbian artist who has won many awards for his art. Faozan Rizal is an artist from Indonesia and is also one of Asia's most critically acclaimed film directors. Between them, the story of their art is one of beauty, resolution and peace as each finds his own answers in the troubling world around them.



United States, 58'

This is the first film ever made on Fijian masi or tapa cloth. It shows the harvesting of the trees and the treatment of the bark, dyeing, designing and stenciling, CLOTH OF THE GODS also demonstrates the significant part played by masi cloth in the traditional life of Fiji, its religion, its ceremonies and rituals. We interview crafts people who are committed to preserving this ancient art form.

Finally, Bernardo has an idea: Elmire should confide in an old and wise hermit who lives in a romantic hut in the forest. This hermit is Erwin in disguise, set up by no other than Bernardo. Erwin now hears from Elmire's own lips that she loves him.

#### The Mysteries of Tango


Argentina, 10x30'

The history of Tango starts with the birth of the songs in Tango influenced by singers who started to incorporate the theme of the "lost love" in their songs, the arrivals of hundreds of thousands of migrants to Argentina, the boom of brothels, myth of the great Gardel, the teaching of the steps as taught in the 30's, 40's and 50's, tango and politics, Piazzolla's revolution and the internalization of the Tango.

#### Seaman Dan & Friends

Australia,

Although he has played music most of his life, Seaman Dan only released his first album 'Follow The Sun' at the age of 71. Dan tells wonderful anecdotes - about hanging around in the legendary Darnley Deeps waiting to decompress, about sharks circling him as he waited and about life on the Torres Strait Islands, Australia. His recollections recreate a time and atmosphere that is both romantic but also highly dangerous.

#### **The Bhangra Generation**

Canada, 48

This enlightening film on the fast growing phenomenon called Bhangra. The film examines the lives of four Indo-Canadian artists, who are making their mark in the world through dance and music. Most prominent of the four is international Bhangra superstar Jazzy B. Bhangra, which originated as both a dance form and a musical form in the Northern Indian state of Punjab, has become an integral part of the worldwide Punjabi culture and Diaspora, playing a revolutionary role akin to black music in America.

#### Music is My Life, Politics My Mistress


USA. 56

Poet, jazz singer, composer, trade union activist and senatorial candidate, Oscar Brown Jr., was a self-educated polymath whose voice, both musical and political, reached the empowered and disempowered alike. A playful and charismatic performer, Brown was also an acclaimed jazz lyricist who worked with Abbey Lincoln and Nina Simone and collaborated with Miles Davis and Bobby Timmons. His entire life can be read as a parable of the civil rights and Black Power era.

#### Words from the City

Australia, 90'

Filmed amid sold out concerts, impromptu freestyles and beachside festivals, the film follows the daily lives of artists at the vanguard of Australian hip hop, a movement that is exploding onto the musical landscape as one of our most powerful and energetic creative forms. Focusing on the unique lyrical and verbal artistry, the film follows Wire MC, Hilltop Hoods, Downsyde, TZU and MC Trey amongst others.







#### **Documentaries - Environment**

#### **Saving the Life Keepers**

Canada, 52', 2013

Local citizens, farmers, small and large businesses as well as beekeepers are trying to protect bee populations throughout the world. This documentary offers several practical solutions including utilizing the biodiversity of plants, mass plantings of protein rich flowers, Queen bee organic mating yards, how to fight bee parasites and diseases without chemicals and antibiotics and finally, how beekeepers work successfully with productive and resistant Africanized bees.

#### A Worm in the Apple

Australia, 52'/64', 2011

Australia's Tasmania is one of the most pristine places on Earth yet its rain forests are under constant attack. This film is a sad reflection on the greed, corruption and destruction of Tasmania's beautiful wilderness. It shows how wildlife is being decimated, people are being poisoned and farmers are driven from their land. It reveals the impact these practices have on climate change and the lives of everyone on Earth.

#### **The Future Makers**

Australia, 46'

Australia may be one of the world's largest producers and exporters of coal for electricity and it has some of the world's largest renewable energy resources. A number of Australians are world leaders in the field of renewable energy and sustainable solutions. Some draw energy and inspiration from nature in their clean technology designs.

#### Last Yoik in Saami Forests?

Finland, 59', 2006

The conflict between forestry and nature conservation in Finland has been constant during last 20 years. The traditional grazing reindeer herding, dependent of the old growth forests has been losing its resources and protests haven't been able to stop this process. We follow the conflict between Greenpeace, the Finish government, reindeers and loggers and also seeks a middle path between preserving the culture of the original inhabitants and the urge for development.







#### **The First Wave**

Australia, 26

The people of the Carteret Islands are about to make history. They will soon begin abandoning their small chain of islands as rising seas make them increasingly uninhabitable. These islands are a group of coral atolls, just north of Papua New Guinea. They will be the first people in the world to make such a move, but they will not be the last.



#### Subak

Singapore, 52'

'The 'Subak' is Bali's old irrigation system with an underlying philosophy of harmony. Mutual agreements govern planting cycles, the division of water resources, the financial contribution of members, and the rights and responsibilities of members. The documentary will demonstrate how it's possible for humans to live in harmony with nature through traditional methods and mutual cooperation.



#### **Mother Earth Speaks**

Indonesia, 52

Our earth is falling apart and it is a fact that we human beings are responsible for its impaired state. We have facts and statistics to make us exclaim in horror and shake our heads in disbelief but that is as far as it goes for many of us. Filmed by Faozan Rizal, this documentary captures some of the most amazing images on our earth which tell their own story of our continual neglect and abuse of our environment and planet.



#### The Mud

Indonesia 52

It's was one of the worst and biggest environmental accident of all times. In Sidoarjo, Indonesia, mud burst from beneath the earth's surface, displacing hundreds of villages and residents. Geologists have estimated that the mud will continue to flow for the next 30, and maybe 100 years!

Sail along the east coast of Australia with a passionate crew of whale enthusiasts. Be amazed as the whales adopt the Goodewind as a welcome companion whilst they migrate north to the Great Barrier Reef.



#### The Golden Dragon and Upper Bird Singapore, China, 50'

Two exotic creatures have taken on a mythical and even magical dimension in their relationships to human beings. The Arowana fish is a fortune fish that according to Chinese it bears luck to anybody who keeps it. This magical symbol drives Chinese people to worship and conduct religious ceremonies. The 'upper' bird is the Enggang which is sacred to the Dayak people, representing the god of war.



#### **World of Wild Wolves**

Russia, 53'

Filmed in Russia over more than 4 years, this exceptional documentary uncovers how these amazing animals survive, and the incredible communities they create. Viewers learn why wolves choose to live in packs, how they share the care and feeding of the young, and how they defend their territory. Mating occurs at the end of the winter and pups are born in the spring. The entire pack takes a part in raising the young and then, in summer, the pups start hunting with the others.



#### Why Icarus Can't Fly

Singapore, 50'

This insightful documentary seeks to elucidate the secrets and wonders of flight. We will take the viewers through the flying styles of the oldest flyer in the world – the dragon fly, moving on to arguably the most beautiful insect flyer – the butterfly, and then we look into the bumblebee myth – is it true that, technically, bees cannot fly? For our feathered friends, we look at the good flyer – the eagle; the poor flyer – the chicken and the no-flyer – the kiwi bird.



#### The Law of the Wolf

Russia, 53'

This is the true story of four wolf cubs that after losing their parents learn how to hunt and survive. As they grow they learn to fight for their territory. The forest hides many traps which could prove fatal, even to predators like them. To survive, they become a real wolf pack. The arrival of other wolves into their territory can mean only one thing – war.



#### Living Treasures

Singapore, 8x23'

This series seeks to provide a visual feast of marine life that is teaming in and around the shores of Singapore. It showcases the richness of existing marine biodiversity, and the remaining precious marine ecosystems that shelter them. With the breathtaking scenery of its marine habitats as a backdrop and complemented by splendid up-close shots of marine fauna and flora, we rediscover and celebrate marine heritage.



#### **Marine Passions**

Australia, 52'

Filmed in Byron Bay, the most easterly point of Australia and five years in the making, hundreds of hours of footage from over 1000 dives were used to create this startling production. Submerge the senses into world's beyond imagination in this visual extravaganza. Encounter graceful manta rays, inquisitive turtles, awe inspiring sharks and become one with the underwater world.



#### **Byron Underwater**

Australia, 57'

Tropical and temperate waters converge at the most easterly point of Australia to create a habitat for an amazing variety of marine life. Discover a haven for sea turtles and one of the few remaining refuges for the critically endangered grey nurse shark. Watch the manta rays soaring and learn more about the mysterious and prehistoric looking leopard sharks

#### **Emergency Exit**

Argentina, 62', 2012

Argentina may lead South America in terms of progressive social politics - but the gap between cultural mores and recently accorded rights to gays and lesbians is palpable. A toxic atmosphere encompassing Catholicism and machismo, the complexity of coming out is further compounded by class, historical and rural-urban as well as aboriginal-settler tensions.



Australia, 55', 2012

Ballroom dancing is the ultimate traditional sport. With a reputation for being overtly heterosexual and inflexible rules that specifically bar same-sex couples from competitions, it should be the last sport on earth in which gay men and lesbians would participate. But at a small studio in Melbourne a passionate group of same sex ballroom dancers is defying the rules

#### Dos patrias, Cuba y la noche

Germany, Cuba, 84', 2007

Are the desire for love, sexual freedom and the fight against discrimination still found and fought in Cuba? Six men from different backgrounds describe their lives, afflictions, wishes, longings and joys in Cuba. They have something in common: they are gay and they feel a daily exclusion from the macho society, and government.

#### Searching 4 Sandeep

Australia, 55', 2007

Sydney based Poppy, is forced online in her search for love. When she meets online 31 year old Anglo/Indian Sandeep, she thinks she's found the one. Unfortunately, Sandeep lives at home with her conservative Sikh parents and three younger sisters.



#### Packed Lunch

Australia, 24', 2007

Speedos, budgie-smugglers, sluggos dick-stickers, togs, racing briefs, bikinis, trunks, g-strings - however you wear them, they're often linked to gay. It's the seductiveness of the style, the sexiness of the fabric, the tease of tightly-pack lunch and bums in these figure-hugging bathers, leaving just enough to the imagination. The film explores the appeal of the minimal pieces of Lycra, their role in body image, and their inherent link to gay culture.



#### Saints & Sinners

United States, 71, 2004

'After living together for 7 years in a seemingly accepting community in New York, Edward and Vincent decide to get married. But unlike many other gay couples who formalize their relationship, Vincent and Edward, both devout Catholics, will settle for nothing short of the "Holy Sacrament of Marriage." Sinners" explores the social, political and religious



aspects of same-sex marriage.



#### Sister Galvan

New Zealand, 89', 2003



Galvan McNamara lives a hermit's life on the banks of a New Zealand river. A legendary arts professional, he spends his days with his much-loved dog Ozka-Ra and his animals, reading and talking with lesbian feminism. Galvan presents his experience of gay life, prostate cancer, tattooing, Richard Grune and renowned New Zealand artist Colin McCann.
